James Richardson talked to us about schooling and education problems. There are children wanting to go to school and make a career but their parents can't pay for uniform or school stationery. He also talked about the political problems of Guatemala. The charity he worked for wanted to provide a basic education for poor children in Guatemala.

As you know, we had a non-uniform day and brought in £1 each as a donation with pencils and other little stationery items to help the Guatemalan children! Watch this space for photos of






Are you struggling with finding mistakes in your work?

- Eating bananas is a neutral cure to reduce effects of stress and anxiety.




